

## Guidelines for Sponsoring A Transplant Surgeon Designee Course

- 1. Any federally-certified renal transplant facility may contact Quality Insights Renal Network Three (QIRN3) for guidelines on sponsoring a Transplant Surgeon Designee Course.
- 2. The NW maintains an email list of NJ dialysis facility contacts and will support transplant designee programs by informing the dialysis community of courses when requested by sponsoring centers.
- 3. Individuals certified as designees are responsible for keeping their certification current and providing their facilities with copies of their certificates.
- 4. The NW recommends that the Transplant Designee Course should include at minimum the following curriculum:
  - i. Basic Introduction and Overview of Transplantation
  - ii. The Role of the Transplant Surgeon Designee (guidelines provided by QIRN3)
  - iii. Evaluation of the Transplant Candidate (Inclusion/Exclusion criteria)
  - iv. Living Donor Kidney Transplant (including Evaluation of the Living Donor)
  - v. Psychosocial Issues in Transplantation (emotional, social, financial, vocational)
  - vi. Short and Long Term Complications of Transplant
  - vii. Discussion of multiple listing
  - viii. Practical application of learning such as education about initiating/continuing the work of designee in facility and discussion of best practices
  - ix. Offer specific topics that are related to current issues and trends in transplantation both locally and nationally
- 5. Content should be general and not center specific as the certification of a Transplant Surgeon Designee is a state-wide designation. Attendees should be made aware that they are to refer a patient to a program of the patient's choice and which best fits his/her needs.
- 6. The Transplant Surgeon Designee Course should offer contact hour credits and a Transplant Surgeon Designee Certificate. The Network recommends that designees be educated and certified annually.
- 7. The Transplant Surgeon Designee must be a licensed individual such as a registered nurse (RN) or a social worker (SW).
- 8. The target audiences for this course may include registered dietitians and patient care technicians who could support the transplant designee in its role.
