Cancer Survivorship: The PCP's Role

Description

This <u>45-minute_e-learning course</u> explores topics related to cancer survivorship and discusses important themes for primary care providers who are overseeing the care of cancer survivors. This program incorporates educational aspects for health care professionals as well as meaningful resources to improve patient care as it is provided to those with an active or past cancer diagnosis. The information presented is appropriate for nurses, physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and other office staff.
