

Helpful Tips for a Successful Influenza Vaccination Campaign

Implementing a vaccination campaign at a dialysis facility requires planning and coordination. Here are some steps to take:

- 1. Join ESRD Network 3 2023-2024 Vaccination Campaign:
 - a. Post the <u>pledge form</u> in the facility waiting room and staff lounge. A <u>Spanish</u> <u>version</u> of the pledge form is also available
 - b. Click here to "Join the Protect, Prevent, Vaccinate Campaign" today and pledge to implement activities to educate and promote vaccinations

2. Set Goals:

- a. CMS goal: Achieve 90% of eligible patients vaccinated against influenza.
- b. CMS goal: Achieve 90% of eligible staff vaccinated against influenza.
- 3. Designate a vaccination champion to lead the efforts.
- 4. Plan the vaccination days:
 - a. Consider scheduling on the last day before the patients' long weekend in case any side effect is experienced.
 - b. Consider scheduling on the day before the staff's day off in case any side effect is experienced.

5. Raise awareness:

- a. Choose a *positive* and *catchy* vaccination slogan to use. *Make it fun.*
- b. Use bulletin boards, flyers, posters, videos, fact sheets and other educational materials to reinforce the message and address common concerns and misconceptions.
- c. Review *"How to Make Strong Recommendations"* resource tools and train staff to effectively educate about the vaccine.
- d. Announce when the vaccination event will take place.
- 6. Offer opportunities for one-on-one discussions to address specific concerns:
 - a. Utilize motivational interviewing techniques.
 - b. Leverage life goals and what matters most during discussion.
- 7. Ensure enough vaccine doses are available.
- 8. Give a copy of most recent <u>Vaccine Information Statement</u> (VIS) prior to vaccination.
- 9. Provide motivation and incentive:
 - a. Vaccinate staff on the floor where patients can see.
 - b. Use printable <u>"I Got My Flu Vaccine"</u> stickers for patients and staff who have received flu vaccine. <u>Spanish sticker template</u> is also available.
 - These downloadable stickers can be printed on laser and inkjet printers. They fit Avery label numbers: 22807, 22817, 22825, 41464, 41494, 22923, 22933, 22921, 22961, 80510, 92807, 4227.



- 10. Provide proof of vaccination to patients and staff.
- 11. Obtain and record reason for vaccination refusal.
- 12. Track your vaccination rates and follow up with patients and staff who have not yet been vaccinated to address any of their concerns or questions.
- 13. Documentation:
 - Non-Batching Organizations
 - Patient Vaccinations are recorded in EQRS

 - Batching Organizations
 - Record *patient vaccination* in the appropriate EMR location as directed by your organization.
 - Record *staff vaccination* in appropriate applications as directed by your organization.
- 14. Review your progress toward goal using the ESRD Facility Dashboard in your monthly QAPI meetings.
- 15. Gather feedback from patients and staff and use this feedback to improve the vaccination campaign.
