Important Documents

- Identification
- Insurance card(s)
- List of medications
- Monthly lab report
- Vaccination records of animals, if applicable

Water and Food

- Non-perishable foods
 - Canned, pop-top, low-sodium green beans, corn, peas
 - Applesauce
 - Unsalted peanut butter
 - Low-sodium tuna, crab, chicken, salmon, or turkey
- Bottled water, cranberry or apple juice
- Food, water, and medications for any animals

Clothes and Toiletries

- Change of clothes
- Sturdy shoes
- Toilet paper
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Feminine personal hygiene
- Medications
- Leash, cage, cleaning supplies, etc. for pets

Emergency Tools

- Flashlight
- Cell phone and charger
- Blankets
- Whistle
- Battery-powered radio

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
