- Provide remote access to the EHR to complete chart review (up to 120 patients diagnosed with asthma/year).
- Participate in two asthma educational seminars/webinars per year (will be provided).
- Engage with the Quality Insights Practice Transformation Specialist in person or virtually (30-60 min/month).
