Determination of Terminal Diagnosis

Primary Caregiver Available

Patient/Family Choose Hospice Philosophy

Physician Certifies Terminal Diagnosis

Hospice is Responsible for Coordinating all the Care

Hospice Bears Financial Responsibility

Team Approach Medications, Supplies, **Benefits of Medicare** and Equipment **Respite Benefit** Hospice related to Terminal Disease 100% Acute Care in Facility Setting for Uncontrolled Symptoms, Collapse of Support System, or Imminent Death

Cost Covered by Medicare 100%

Ongoing Support for Bereaved Family
